LORD OF THE RINGS SYMPHONIC SUITE

Howard Shore wrote over 80 themes (more or less depending on whose analysis you read) for the Lord of the Rings trilogy, with the themes morphing and evolving throughout the movies in response to the story, called leitmotifs, and pioneered by Wagner in his operas. There is immense depth in how the themes interact with the story and with each other, so consider the below list as only scratching the surface. Howard Shore went on to write 65 new themes and reprise 50 of the themes from the original trilogy when he composed the music to The Hobbit trilogy.
